### Passover Instructions in the Torah

Exodus 12: How the first Passover was celebrated.

**Exodus 34: 18:** Command to celebrate the Feast of Unleavened Bread and to eat unleavened bread.

**Leviticus 23: 4 – 8:** How to celebrate Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread.

**Numbers 9: 1- 14:** The Second time the Passover was celebrated by the children of Israel. Those who were unclean or on a long journey were permitted to celebrate the Passover in the second month of lyar.

Numbers 28: 16 – 25: List of offerings and sacrifices to bring on the Sabbath – rest days of Passover and Unleavened Bread.

Numbers 33: 1 - 3: Elohim told Moses to write about their journey through the wilderness, and writes when Israel left Egypt.

**Deuteronomy 16: 1- 8:** How to celebrate the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread.

# Passover Scripture Reading List

**Deuteronomy 16: 16 – 17:** Passover is one of the three pilgrimage feasts.

Deuteronomy 26: Summary of what happened in Egypt.

#### Passover Celebrated in Israel

**Joshua 5: 1 – 12:** The first Passover celebrated in the Promised Land.

- 2 Kings 22: King Josiah and the priests found the Torah for the first time in years.
- 2 Kings 23: 21 25: After cleansing the land and the Temple of idols and wickedness, they celebrated Passover for the first time since the time of the Judges.
- 2 Chronicles 30: 1 27: A command to celebrate the Passover in the second month, by King Josiah, because there weren't enough priests purified to perform the Passover in the first month.

Ezra 6: 16 – 22: After the Babylonian Captivity the children of Israel celebrated Passover.

**Ezekiel 45: 21 – 24:** Passover celebrated during the 3rd Temple period.

### Songs of Praise for Deliverance

**Exodus 15:** Song that Moses and the children of Israel sang when Elohim delivered them from the Egyptians in the Red Sea.

2 Samuel 22: King David's song of joy when Elohim delivered him from all his enemies.

**Psalms 66:** A song of joy to Elohim. David also recounts the Exodus story.
